

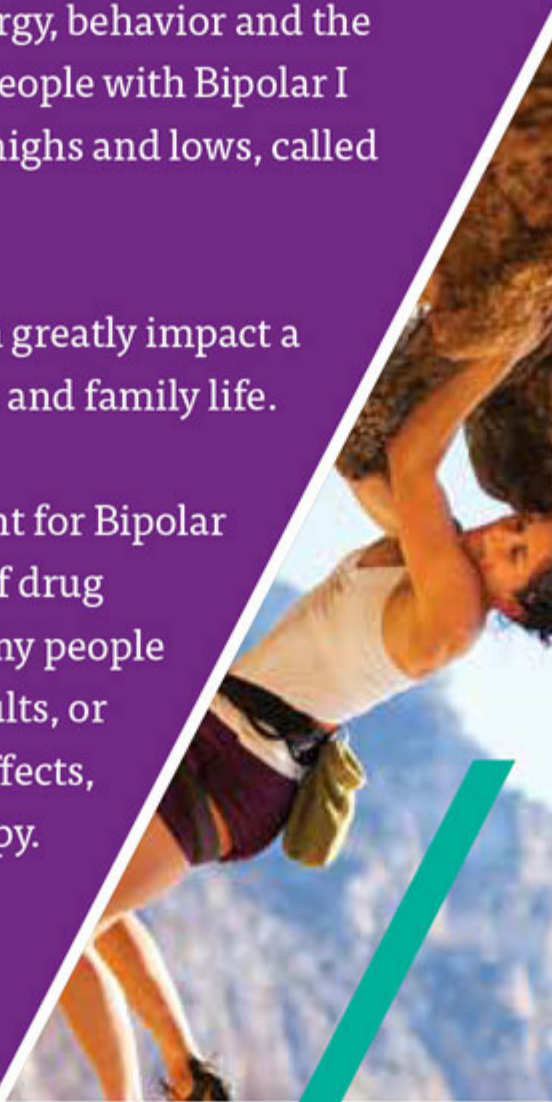
## About the Study

Explore your opportunity to be part of a clinical research study investigating a medication that may help bring control and balance in your life for the treatment of Bipolar I Depression.

# How does the study work?

Before any study procedures occur, you must go through a screening which may include: medical history, physical exam, medical questionnaires, blood and urine tests, pregnancy test, and electrocardiogram (ECG).

If you and your doctor decide this is a good option, you will be enrolled to receive this investigational medication.

This study lasts approximately 9 weeks, including a screening period of up to 14 days, followed by a 6 week treatment period and 1 week safety follow-up period.

During this time, you will be randomly assigned to receive either the investigational medication or a placebo. The placebo looks like the study drug, but has no active drug in it. Neither you nor the person administering the medication will know if you are receiving the active drug or the placebo.

At your study visits during the treatment period, you may receive a general health assesment.



# Am I Eligible?

- 18 – 65 Years Old
- Diagnosed with Bipolar I Depression
- No Other Participation in a Clinical Research Study in the Past 6 Months

You may be eligible to participate in this study if you are between 18 – 65 years old, have been diagnosed with Bipolar I Depression, are currently suffering a major depressive episode that has lasted more than 4 weeks but not longer than 12 months.

# Why should I participate?

### Benefits

This medication may help balance your moods more effectively in the treatment of Bipolar I Depression. Eligible participants will receive study related tests and procedures at no cost.

### Risks

There are risks associated with any medication. Your doctor will review the risks with you prior to the start of the trial.
